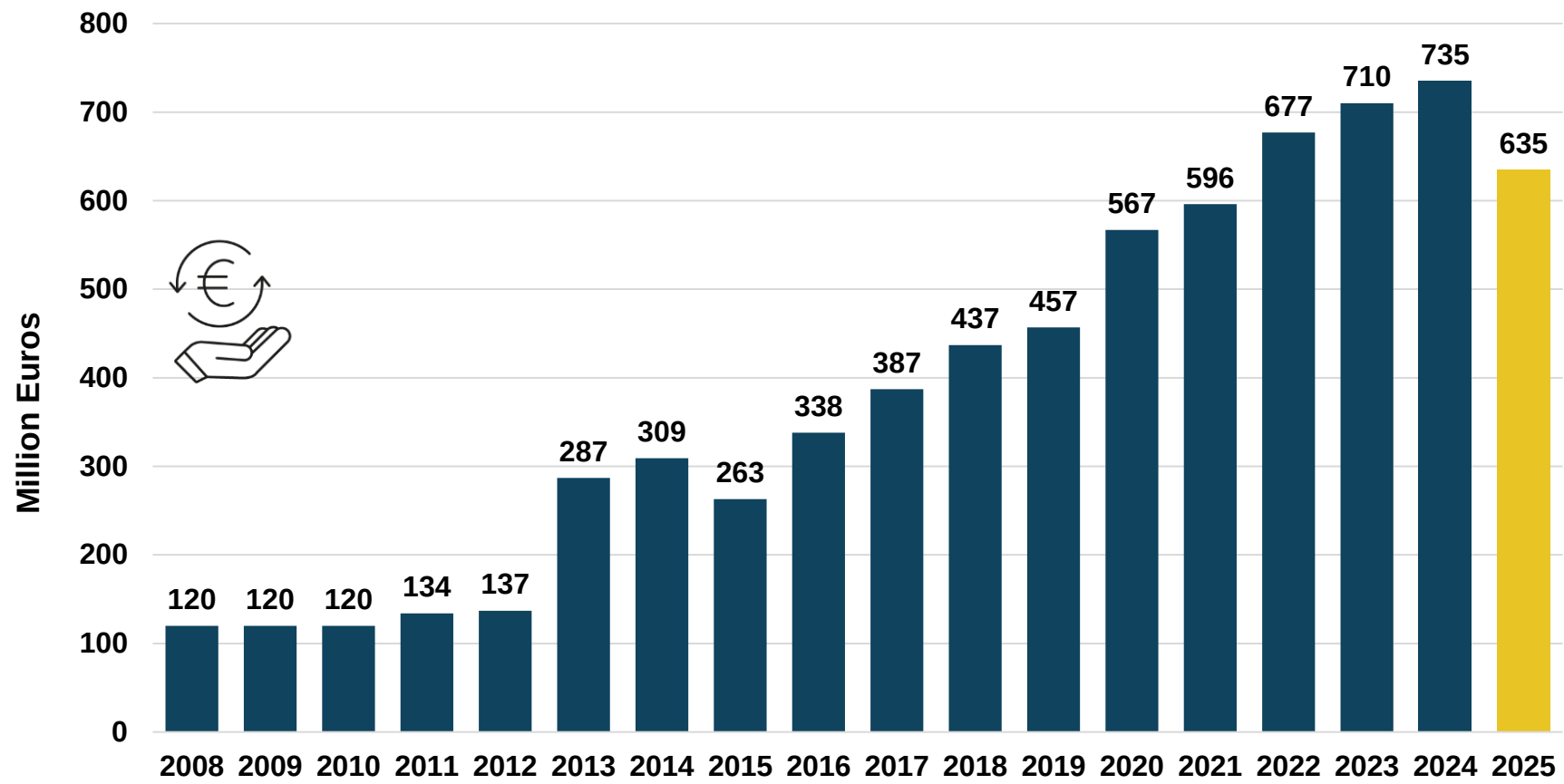

Budget development

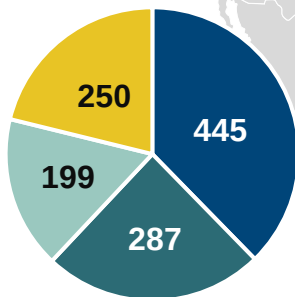


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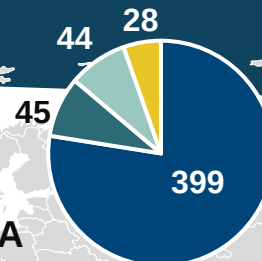
2008-2024, in million euros

- Conservation of biological diversity

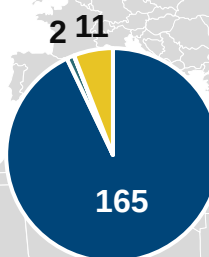

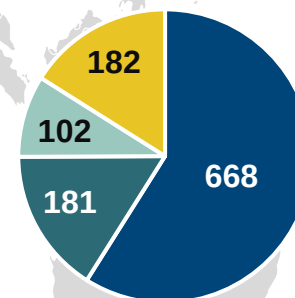
Central and Eastern Europe,

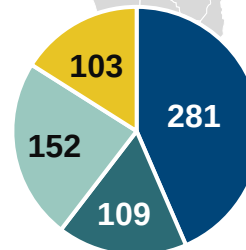

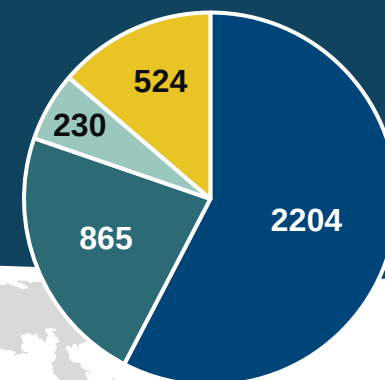

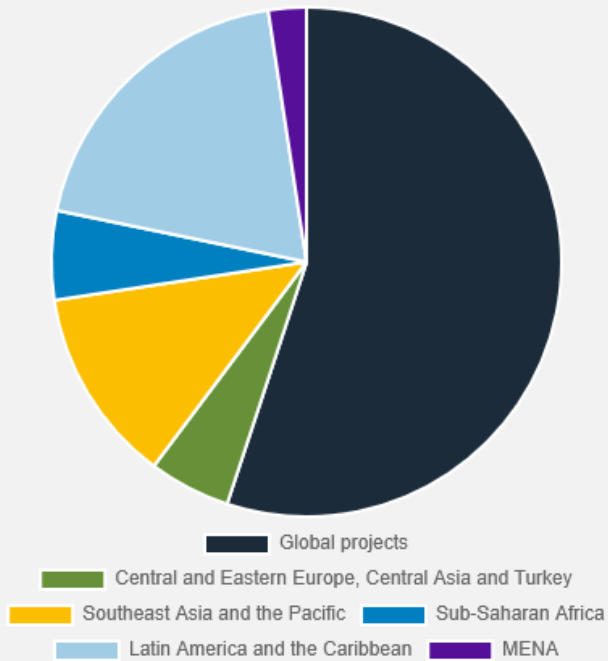

Commitments were distributed across the various regions as follows (rounding differences possible):

- Global: EUR 458 million
- Central and Eastern Europe, Central Asia and Turkey: EUR 43 million
- South Asia, Southeast Asia and the Pacific (Asia): EUR 103 million
- Sub-Saharan Africa (Africa): EUR 47 million
- **Central and Latin America and the Caribbean: EUR 161 million**
- Middle East and North Africa (MENA): EUR 20 million

Why programme level monitoring?

Programme level monitoring has many functions, for example:

- **Promoting accountability:** It ensures that public funds are used effectively and for their intended purposes.
- **Promoting transparency:** By tracking results and impacts, stakeholders, including the public, can see how resources are being allocated and the outcomes achieved.
- **Informing decision-making:** Monitoring provides valuable data that can inform future funding decisions. Understanding what works and what doesn't helps in refining strategies.
- **Measuring success and demonstrating impacts:** It helps in assessing whether the IKI meets its objectives.

In the current international political climate...

- Climate/biodiversity action has become a highly politicised issue
- Disinformation is spreading worldwide
- Financial resources are contested
- Pressure to justify use of funds increased

... results / impact monitoring on a programme level is especially crucial for IKI's accountability.

The IKI strategy up to 2030

- Defines how the IKI will contribute to overcoming the climate and biodiversity crises in developing and emerging countries up to 2030
- Bundles competencies of the Federal Government in the lead ministries for climate action, biodiversity conservation and foreign policy (BMWK, BMUV and AA)
- Provides focus as well as flexibility for maximum impact
- Allows for strategic steering of the funding program

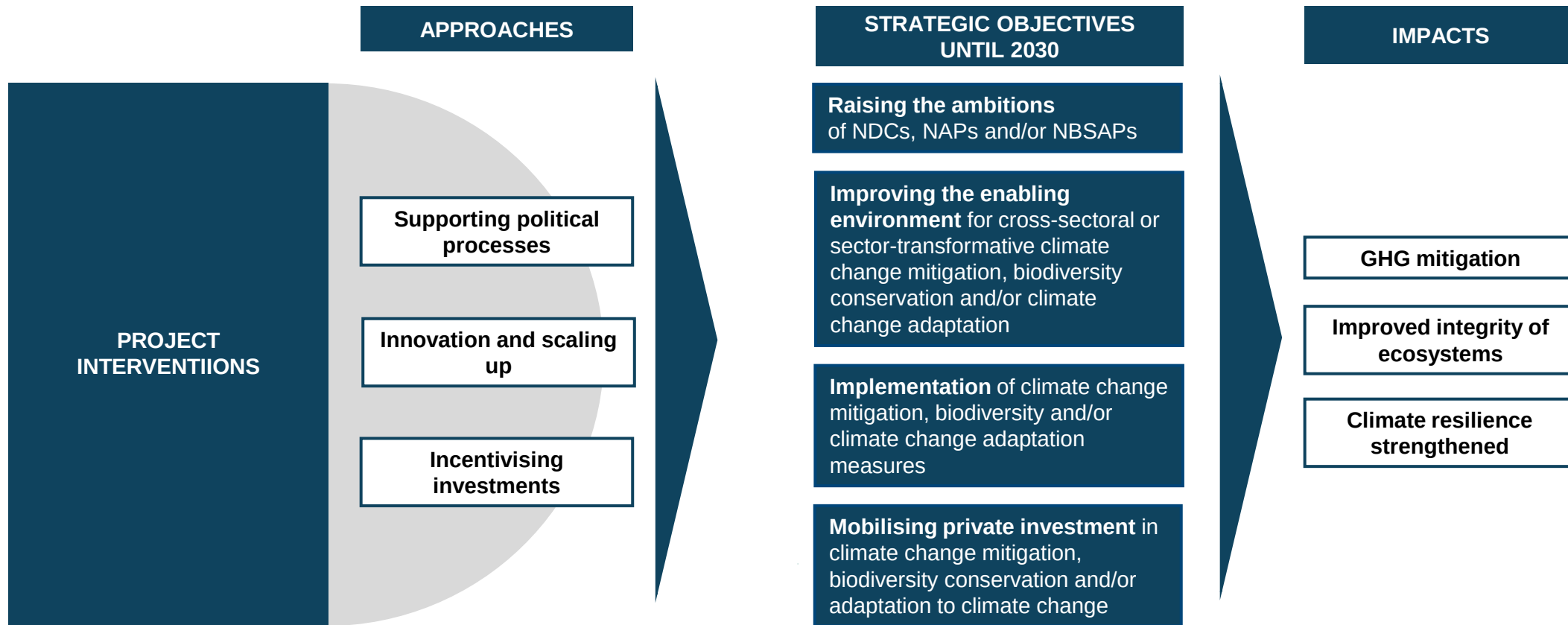

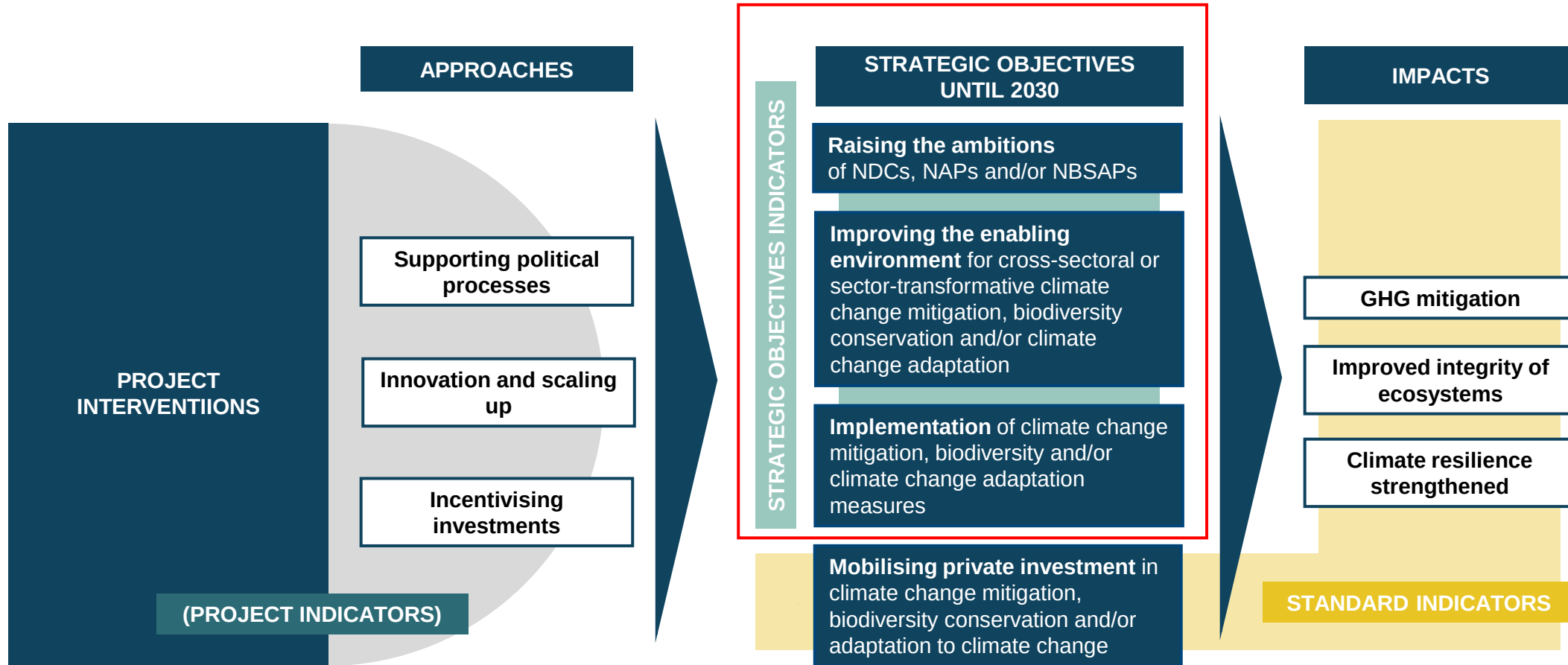

IKI's Standard Indicators

Revised IKI standard indicators (from 2022)

SI 1 - Mitigation	Greenhouse gas emissions reduced or carbon stocks enhanced directly or indirectly by project measures (in tonnes of CO2 equivalents (t CO2eq)).
SI 2 - Ecosystems	Area of ecosystems with improved conservation and sustainable use due to project measures (in hectares).
SI 3 - Adaptation	Number of people directly or indirectly supported by projects to better adapt to the effects of climate change.
SI 4 - Capacity People	Number of people directly supported by IKI projects through networking and training to address climate change and/or to conserve biodiversity.'
SI 5 - Leveraged Finance	Volume of private and/or public finance leveraged for climate action or biodiversity purposes in EUR.

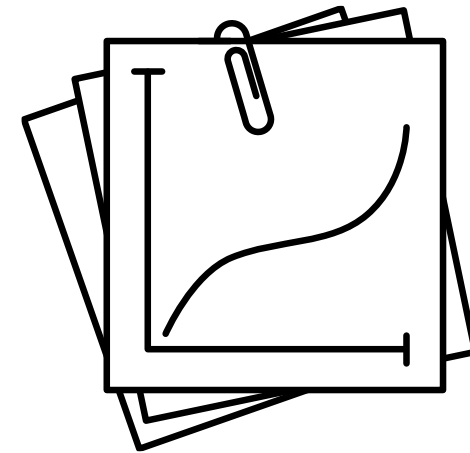

- Starting with the 2025 annual report (due in 2026), all **projects are required to complete Annex 9: IKI's Strategic Objectives Report**.
- This report will include a qualitative assessment of how each project contributes to IKI's Strategic Objectives.
- Projects should only report on those Strategic Objectives that are relevant to their work.
- Additionally, the **Guidelines for Project Planning and Monitoring** will be updated to include a chapter that provides detailed guidance on completing the Annex.

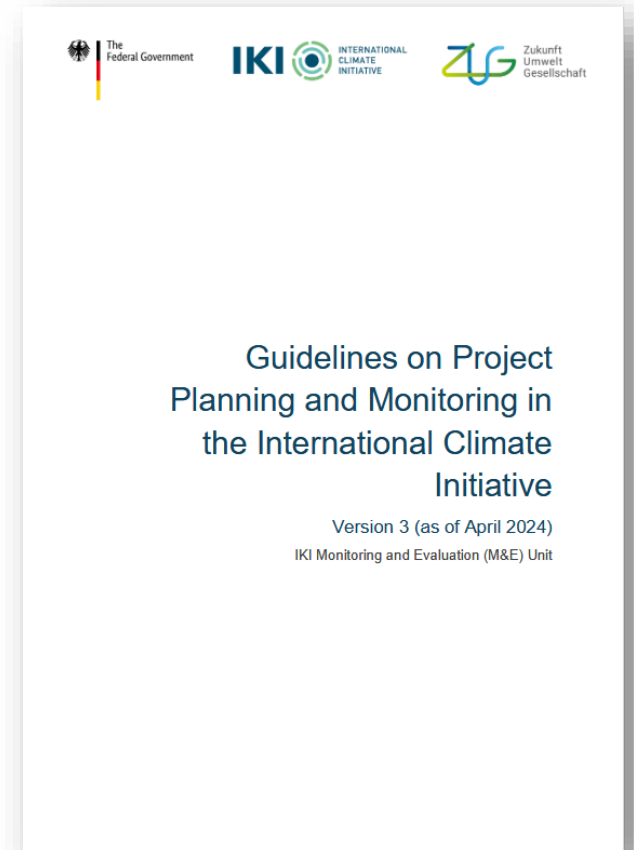
